

WORKING ARRANGEMENTS

Salary

£12 - £12.89 per hour depending on experience, qualifications and project responsibilities.

Pension

Under the current pensions legislation you will be enrolled into an 'auto-enrolment' pension scheme if you are eligible. If you are not automatically enrolled into the scheme you may still be entitled to join with a 4% employer's contribution and 4% employees contribution.

Working Hours

This is a casual worker role that may include daytime, evening and weekend work. The hours would be dependent on the needs of the business and would be agreed and communicated with you on a regular basis.

Lone Working

An element of your role will include lone working, this may include but is not limited to driving, being in the building alone, working one-to-one with a learner and delivering to a group of learners independently.

Location

The post will be based at Endeavour Centre, Earl Marshal Rd, Sheffield, S4 8FB. Delivery will be both onsite at Endeavour and offsite in and around South Yorkshire and Derbyshire.

Probationary Period

All casual workers will undertake a period of probation to establish their suitability for the post.

Annual Leave

Casual workers accrue holidays at a rate of 7.24 minutes for each hour worked. This equates to an annual entitlement of 5.6 working weeks' (maximum of 28 days) holiday a year, inclusive of any bank/public holidays. When monthly timesheets are submitted you will have the option to save your accrued holidays or be paid for them.

Length of Contract

This is a casual worker role and as such there is no defined length of contract. Work will be offered dependent on the needs of the business.
